THE POINT IN TIME (PINT) HIGH SCHOOL DROP-IN CLINIC OFFERS YOUTH ATTENDING THE LOCAL HIGH SCHOOL A SAFE AND CONFIDENTIAL PLACE TO ACCESS COUNSELLING WITH A TRAINED MENTAL HEALTH WORKER FROM POINT IN TIME THREE DAYS PER WEEK THROUGHOUT THE SCHOOL YEAR.

CLIENTS ACCESSED THE CLINIC DURING THE 2018-19 SCHOOL YEAR. ON AVERAGE, 40% OF CLIENTS ATTENDED ONLY ONCE, OTHERS CAME BACK FOR MORE SESSIONS.

INDIVIDUAL STUDENTS ACCESSED THE CLINIC. MOST OF THEM SELF-REFERRED TO THE CLINIC.

THE TOP PRESENTING ISSUES FOR CLIENTS WERE FAMILY CONFLICT, ANXIETY, PEER RELATIONSHIPS, DEPRESSION AND ANGER/ AGGRESSION.

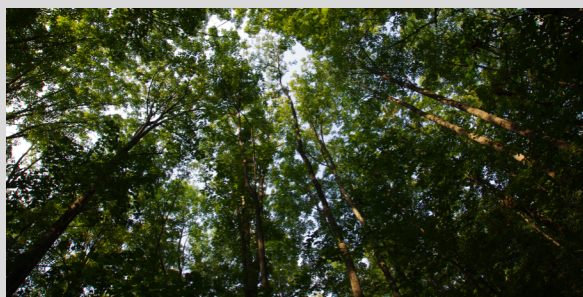
